Regarding Duplicate Presentations at this Meeting

(1) Definition of duplicate presentation

Duplicate presentation refers to a presentation that has substantially the same content as that of a presentation made in public by the presenter in the past (regardless of the language used for the presentation). A presentation that was previously made in closed settings such as an in-house study session is not regarded as a prior presentation leading to a duplicate presentation, even if the content is the same.

(2) Criteria for determining inappropriate duplicate presentations

- The content presented at special lectures upon request from academic societies or at symposiums and other similar occasions is not deemed to be inappropriate.
- It is also not deemed to be inappropriate for a presenter to provide at this meeting the same content as that of a paper they have already published.
- If you present at this meeting the same content as that of a presentation you gave in the past, without the permission of the secretariat, your presentation will be deemed as an inappropriate duplicate presentation. Such prior presentations include presentations you provided in other languages at international conferences.

(3) Actions to be taken for this Meeting

- Inappropriate duplicate presentations are prohibited.
- If the content of your presentation for this meeting is the same as that of a presentation you gave in the past, you must make a self-report at the point of registering the subject of your presentation. The report should include information on the prior presentation, such as the date of the presentation, the name of the academic society or study group, and the title. You also need to report the reason for the intended duplicate presentation.
- The reviewers and Chair will decide whether or not your duplicate presentation is acceptable.
- Even if permission is granted, you must mention in your presentation that the presentation is being made for the second time, to avoid the possible misunderstanding that your individual presentations are based on different studies.
- Furthermore, you must not use the second and subsequent presentations to add to your academic record.
- If your presentation is judged as inappropriate by the reviewers or Chair due to false or absence of advanced self-reporting, the presentation itself will be withdrawn in the name of the Chair.
